

Learning Outcomes: International Studies

Students who have completed an undergraduate major in International Studies will:

- (1) demonstrate competency in another language, sufficient to read and interpret a variety of media and engage in successful interaction with native-speakers;
- (2) have broad knowledge of the historical and cultural heritage of their region of focus;
- (3) demonstrate the ability to apply an international perspective and knowledge from international studies courses to one's primary major;
- (4) have some understanding of the transnational and global context that affects all regions through INST 493; and
- (5) have developed research and analytic skills through INST 493.

Tools for measuring these outcomes:

-Successful completion of INLST 493 course project demonstrating a critical understanding of international issues.

-Successful completion of target language coursework at the 400 level.
